

Life Lifters Kenya empowers rural girls to take control of their lives, make informed decisions about their lives, and advocate for their rights and wellbeing. We are a registered non-governmental organization that invests in disenfranchised smart underprivileged rural girls to enable them to access quality secondary education, comprehensive Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) information, and economic opportunities that positively impact their life outcomes. As an organization we:

Promote gender equality through Girls Education


Implemented through our Girls Educate program, Life Lifters provides disenfranchised smart underprivileged rural girls with comprehensive multi-year scholarships, back-to-school supplies, mentorship and training in sexual reproductive health and rights (SRHR), leadership, and business. We intervene at a catalytic age of 13-19 and eliminate barriers that hinder secondary-school-aged rural girls from accessing quality education in Kenya

Advance Sexual and reproductive rights of young teenage girls

Implemented through our Wasichana Twashinda program, Life Lifters provides comprehensive Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) training to teenage girls aged (11- 19) from rural and grassroots communities. With the overall strategic purpose of increasing high completion rates by preventing early sexual debut, and teenage pregnancy and delaying subsequent pregnancies for teenage mothers, Life Lifters Kenya ensures that all the girls incubated in this program are equipped with quality and timely SRHR information to enable them to make informed decisions about their lives.

Promote economic empowerment of young women

Life Lifters is intentional about increasing rural girls' ability to access and control their financial resources, opportunities, and decisionmaking within the economy. We provide our girls with quality education, comprehensive training, and mentorship to enable them to make informed decisions on how they wish to participate in the economy


OUR APPROACH

Life Lifters Kenya is intentional about investing in Rural Girls' education and Reproductive Health.

These girls are more knowledgeable about nutrition, hygiene, and reproductive health, which reduces the risk of maternal and child mortality, improves family health, and contributes to overall well-being.





2023 GIRLS EDUCATE WINS

Life Lifters Kenya is focused on strengthening the Girls Educate Scholarship Program to effectively and sustainably serve more rural Girls across Kenya. Since inception, the program has awarded 14 scholarships to smart underprivileged teenage girls across 4 different counties.

FIVE GES Scholars Successfully Graduated from High school

In 2023 the GES program incubated 11 scholars. Five scholars successfully graduated from high school at the end of 2023 with qualifying grades that can get them admission to any university/college. This increases our alumni numbers to 8 young women!

Life Lifters' Wasichana Twashinda program seeks to reduce school dropouts among upper primary teenage girls, reduce teenage pregnancy and increase high school transition and participation rate by exposing them to quality comprehensive SRHR training.



2023 WASICHANA TWASHINDA PROGRAM WINS

Twashinda Program provides rural girls with accurate and comprehensive information about their sexual and reproductive health, including topics such as puberty, contraception, sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and menstrual hygiene. This knowledge empowers rural girls to make informed decisions about their bodies, health, and lives

In 2023 we had the following successes:



Menstrual Hygiene Day Celebration 2023

Life Lifters Kenya organized a Menstrual Hygiene
Day celebration in Nandi County Kenya. The Day
brought together MH trainers and rural girls from
3 different schools in the community. Life Lifters
Kenya equipped 33 teenage girls with quality
information and menstrual hygiene products as a
strategy of helping reduce period poverty for the
girls. The Girls were equipped with six months of
sanitary towels!

Comprehensive SRHR Training for rural Girls


Project EmpowerHer, is a comprehensive SRHR training and advocacy program on how to prevent first-pregnancy cases, reduce subsequent pregnancies, and avert unsafe abortion cases for teenage girls in Nandi County. Life Lifters Kenya received funding from Ipas Africa Alliance to implement the project EmpowerHer for 50 teenage girls in the Emgwen and Aldai constituencies in Kenya.






Life Lifters Kenya is striving towards financial sustainability. In 2023 we experienced significant growth in our income. The charts below showcase our revenue and expenses in 2023

A LOOK INTO THE FUTURE

A TOTAL OF 110,821
PREGNANCIES WERE
RECORDED AMONG
ADOLESCENT GIRLS AGED
BETWEEN THE AGES OF
10 TO 19 IN THE FIRST
FIVE MONTHS OF 2023.



Teenage pregnancy has hit crisis levels many rural communities in Kenya and has now become the main driver of school dropouts and early marriage. This vice negatively impacts the health, education, economic prospects and mental wellbeing of many rural girls driving them into deeper cycles of poverty. As 2024 unfolds, Life Lifters Kenya is committed to empowering rural girls. This year our organization will continue to:



Make strategic investments in rural girls' education by supporting more girls to access quality secondary education! We hope to invest at least \$20,000 in rural girls' education and empowerment.

Make investments in rural girls' sexual and reproductive health by ensuring more rural girls in Bungoma, Nandi, Uasin Gishu, and Kakamega have access to quality and timely information on their reproductive health. With the strategic purpose of helping more rural girls continue their education, we will:

- Provide rural girls with quality information and resources to help delay early sexual debut, delay first pregnancy, and prevent/delay subsequent pregnancies among teen mothers.
- We will establish 'Women Dignity centers ' in our communities to ensure more rural girls have access to quality menstrual hygiene products.
- We will also scale project EmpowerHer to reach 100 teenage girls in Nandi and Bungoma County







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
